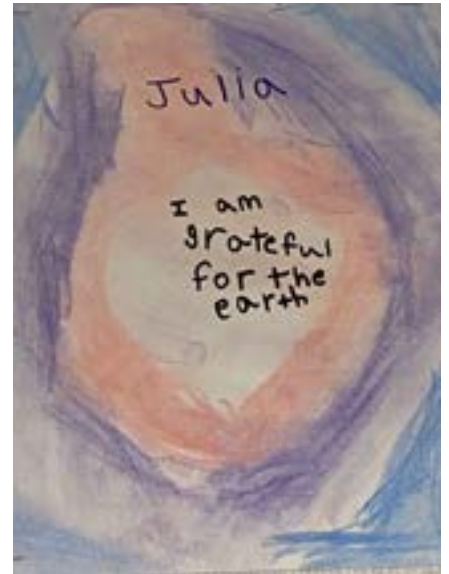
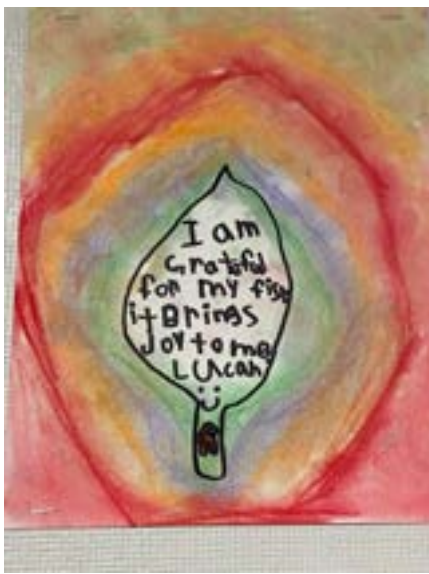

Math: We will soon be moving on from our adding and subtracting unit. Along with practicing basic facts, Grade 3s have been working hard to add and subtract 2- and 3-digit numbers. Grade 4s have been adding and subtracting 3- and 4-digit numbers including decimals to the hundredths place. Having a strong foundation in Math is so important so I strongly encourage everyone to continue practicing their basic addition and subtraction facts at home. New concepts this month will include money, rounding, fractions and problem solving.



LA: Reading: We continue to focus on nonfiction. We are reading to find the main idea and supporting details using evidence and context clues from the text. We have started "Third Grade Angels" by Jerry Spinelli as our class read aloud. Writing: We will soon wrap up our informational writing unit culminating in each child writing their own book about their "Pet Monster". "How To" and Opinion writing are up next.



Science: We will soon be wrapping up our unit on Matter. We are exploring the three states of matter (solid, liquid, gas) and how they change, including the water cycle. We will also be participating in a Scientist in Schools workshop in early November entitled "Properties Really Matter".

Social: We are looking at the quality of life, traditions, celebrations, food, languages, and regions in Peru.

Art: We are wrapping up our Autumn Cubism projects. We will continue to look at the elements of art focusing on line and texture in November.



Wellness: This class compliments PE class. We are currently discussing healthy eating. I would like to challenge students to become actively involved in planning and packing their own healthy snacks and lunches (if they are not doing so already). We will look at "Our Roles" later this month.

Mrs. Hudey--Grade 3/4 November 2023

Here's what we are working on:

Language Arts-

Reading: This month we continue to work on specific predicting, sequencing and inferencing reading strategies.

We are enjoying "A Boy Called Bat" as our class read aloud this month. We have had some fantastic discussions about the books we are reading in class! Students are able to log in and sign books out of the library using their digital accounts.



Writing: In Writers Workshop we are writing, editing and illustrating spooky stories to share with younger students! The students are focusing on story elements like plot, characters, setting and descriptive vocabulary. The students are working hard to make their debut as authors next week in the Kindergarten classroom.

Science - We will be wrapping up our unit on Matter later this month and starting Earth Systems! Students will have the opportunity to participate in a 'Scientists In School' on Nov.8th.

Math - Students have been working on place value, addition and subtraction strategies, decimals, problem solving, estimating and rounding.

Social Studies- We have focused on comparing and contrasting culture, traditions, language and quality of life in Peru.

Art - Students have enjoyed creating projects with color and lines - check out our display at interviews on the 9th!

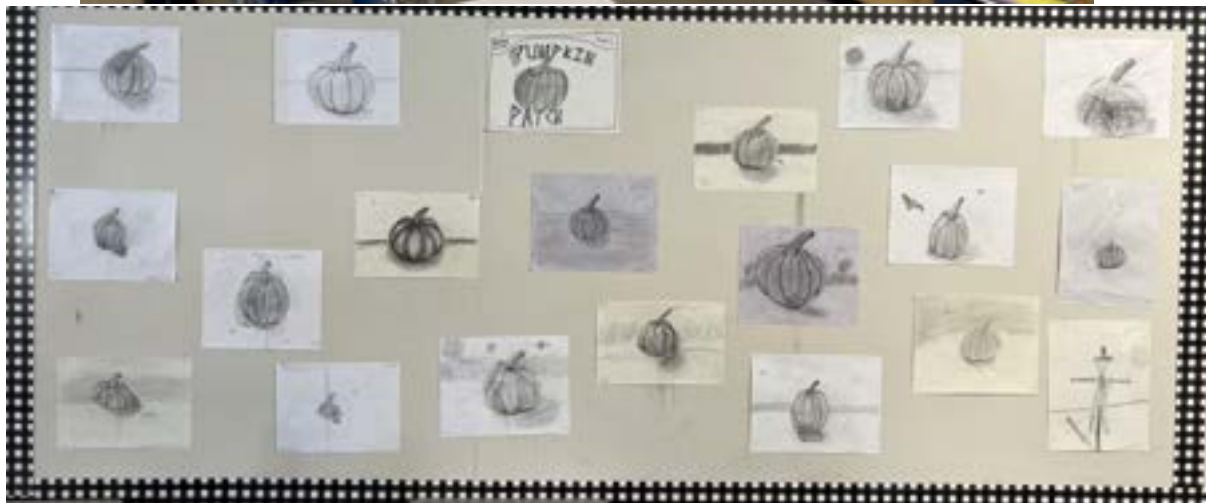
Grade 5 News – Mrs. Hass

This past month in grade 5 has been busy. In science, we have continued to dive deep into Wetland Ecosystems, looking at the roles different organisms play and the energy transfer and interconnectedness of plants and animals in the food chain. We've looked at adaptations for survival in specific habitats, and will finish off our unit looking at the impacts humans can have on ecosystems and ways we can help.

In math, we are continuing to look at number sense. We do image talks to stretch our understanding of mathematical concepts and see things in different ways, we do thinking tasks to challenge ourselves, and we have spent October looking at decimal numbers in addition and subtraction, including money problems. We are moving into factors and divisibility in November, including multiplication and division.

In LA, we have been working hard to complete all of our mini lessons on narrative writing. We are well into our drafting and revising stage, and we stopped to have a dance party to celebrate the completion of our first round of drafting (see pic). Our unit will culminate in a publishing party to celebrate our writing. Parents will get an opportunity to celebrate with their children at Interviews, as we showcase their personal narrative stories!

In art, we have looked at sketching, with our harvest pumpkins, and made 3D spooky houses that we will incorporate into some LA creative writing.



Grade 6 News – Mrs. Jesse

Math: Students continued to work on basic addition and subtraction skills during the daily math portion of our day. They were challenged to tackle many problems using positive and negative integers and played many games to reinforce these concepts. We are moving onto multiplication throughout the month of November. We will focus on factorization and prime and composite numbers. Students are also going to spend some time with exponents this month for the first time in grade 6.

LA: We have finished up our first formal read aloud: *The Tiger Rising*, and our study of narrative elements with a focus on characterization. Students will now be working in small groups to read a shared novel and enhance their practice of deep thinking while reading. In writing, students are revising and editing their personal narratives. Students will celebrate their hard work at the end of November by sharing their finished projects with their classmates.

Science: Students will be finishing up their wetlands unit by mid-November. A favorite activity from this unit was the creation of a hybrid animal focusing on the concepts of adaptations. We will be zipping into our electricity unit, which will take us into the new year.

Social: Students have finished up their Canadian Geography unit and have moved into our Regions of Canada unit. Students will complete 6 research projects throughout the next 2 months. Our final project will be a diorama, where students will be asked to bring some materials from home. I will send out an email closer to that project.
