Principal's Message

It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas! Well, I suppose it isn't with all this warm weather. But Christmas is right around the corner! It is going to be an awesome season - we have a lot of great things going on.

First off, the word of the month that we have chosen for December is "reciprocity" or "giving back". We have a number of initiatives that we are supporting to try and give back to our local community:

- 1) Silver Linings - Mrs. Hudey has partnered with an organization in Coaldale that provides Christmas gifts for seniors. We are collecting aero chocolate bars, popcorn twists, and shampoo to donate to this organization. Some classes will also be writing cards to give to the seniors.
- 2) Angel Tree - we are also a drop off location for Angel Tree again this year. If you are interested in providing a gift, feel free to grab a little "angel" from the office, purchase a gift, and return it to school. We will then deliver them to Angel Tree.
- 3) Food Bank - the last few Christmases we have donated non-perishable food items to the local Food Bank. This is a great way to support families in our Lethbridge communities. Feel free to send any donations with your child(ren).

We also have some great events happening over the next few weeks. First off, we have a simplified version of our "12 days of Christmas" that we will start celebrating next week. A couple members of the Lethbridge Hurricanes will be visiting the school on December 6th. They will hang out with the students at recess and then sign some autographs in each classroom. We also have our mini-volleyball tournament on December 7th, which is always a lot of fun. There will be volleyball starting at 2 o'clock, along with a small concession for students and families. Lastly, we have our Christmas concert on Tuesday, December 19th. We will have an afternoon performance at 1:00 and an evening performance at 6:00. Like last year, we are planning on allocating 2 tickets to each performance per family.

On our Professional Development day on Friday, December 1st, we will be looking at the data collected from our visioning night to start crafting a new mission/vision. It will incorporate a lot of the great things that are happening at our school, as well as the feedback provided by staff, students, and parents. When I have a draft document, I will be sure to share it with parents for feedback.

I also wanted to say thank you to all of you, the parents. This is such a special little school and I am so appreciative of all the work of this wonderful community. Whether we have 6 or 7 parents volunteering for hot lunches, or 20 parents at our School Council meetings, or all of you having conversations with your children about what it means to be kind, respectful, caring members of our school community. Kindergarten-Reindeer antlers (\$ Store)

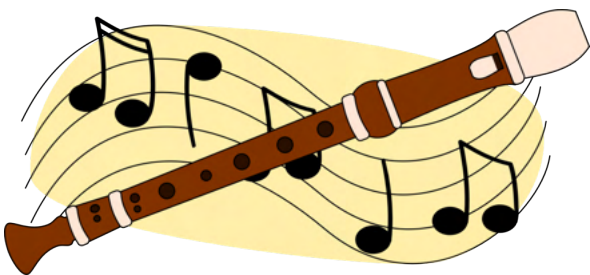
Grade 1/2- any combination of: sunglasses, hat, beaded necklace

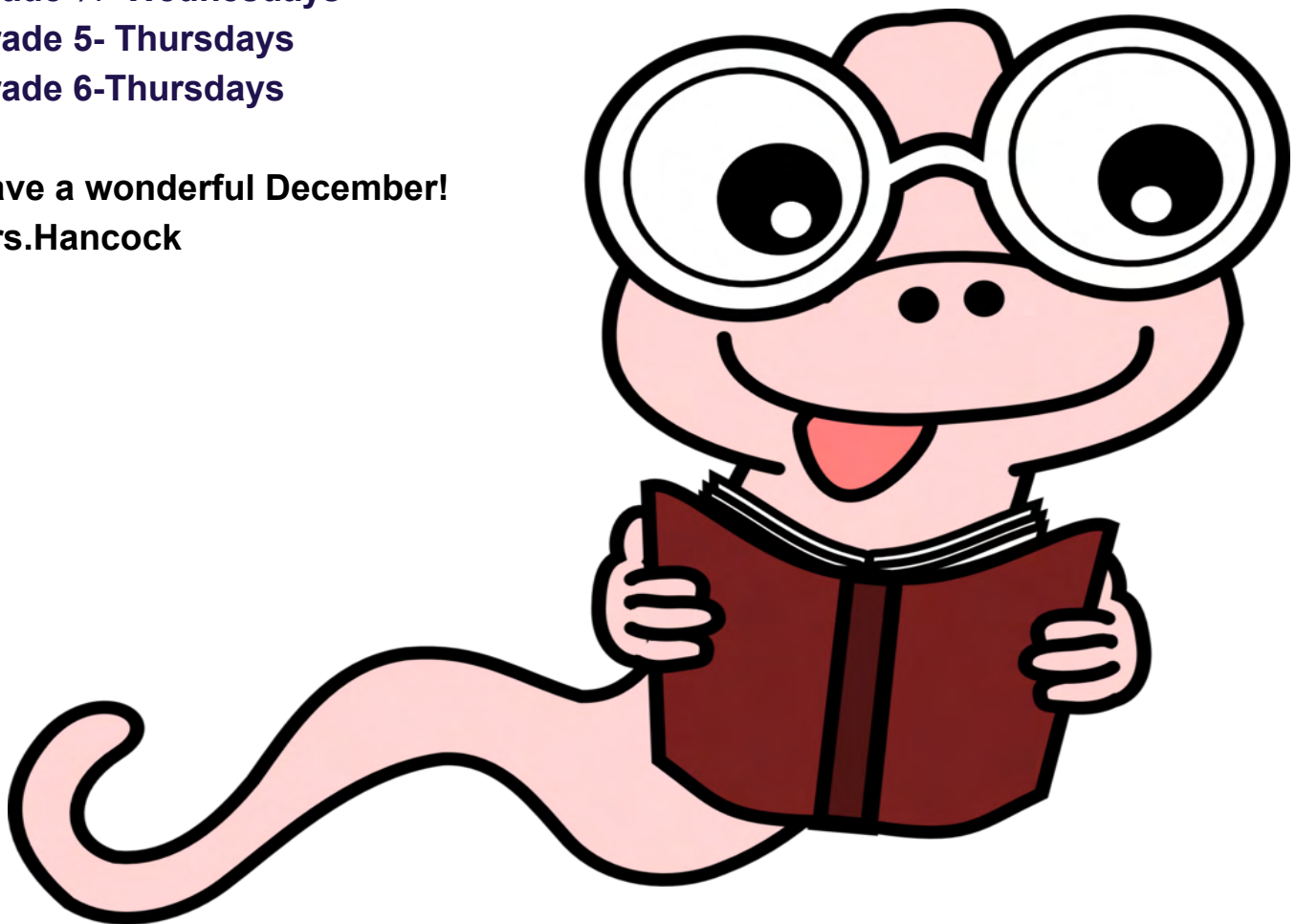

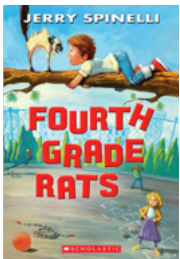
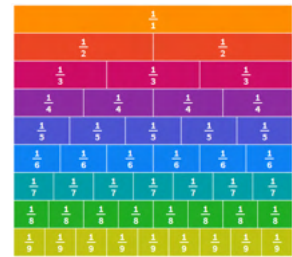
December News from 3/4J



Greetings Parents and Families of 3/4J! I can't believe December is here! With each and everyday the energy levels grow in anticipation for our Christmas Concert and our much needed and deserved Christmas Holidays!!! I hope you and your family have a wonderful holiday season filled with love, laughter and, of course, good food!

We have many things on the go here in our classroom, including new units in most subjects. Here's a brief description of what's going on in our classroom!

Math: We just started our unit on fractions. We want to develop a strong foundation so we will spend a lot of time exploring them including understanding, identifying and comparing fractions (just to name a few).



Reading: In reading we have now turned our attention to fictional reading. Students are being challenged to read higher level novels. We will be spending time looking at characters, setting, problems and solutions, etc. within a story. As a class we are reading "Fourth Grade Rats", Jerry Spinelli's follow up book to "Third Grade Angels"! Such fun reads! We also plan on reading Christmas stories to the Preschool students.

Writing: We have started a unit on descriptive writing. The goal is to start expanding our vocabulary by choosing stronger, more descriptive words for our writing. In Word Work we continue to focus on growth in the areas of phonics, vocabulary, and spelling skills. At the moment we are focusing on adding suffixes to words.

Science: We wrapped up our Matter unit by taking part in an online workshop from Scientists in School. Everyone took part in five different experiments. See some of the pics below. Our new unit is called Changing Earth. We will be looking at how the Earth changes in gradual and sudden ways including layers of the earth, tectonic plates, mountains, glaciers, earthquakes, volcanoes, etc. and that's just the first section!!



Social: We continue to look at the quality of life in Peru, Tunisia, India and Ukraine. Up next is a look at things such as goods and services.

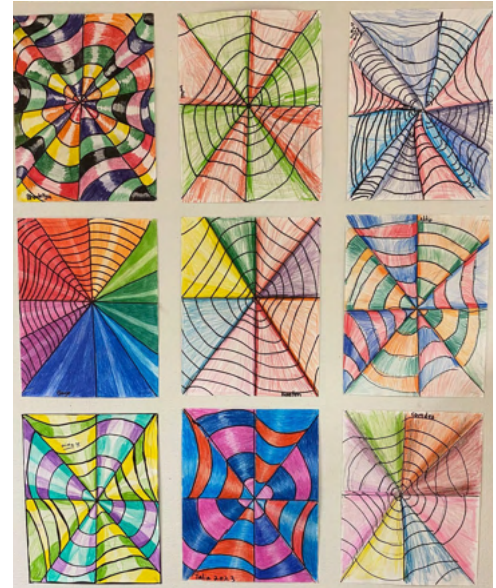


Art: We have completed our 3-D waves. They are looking amazing!

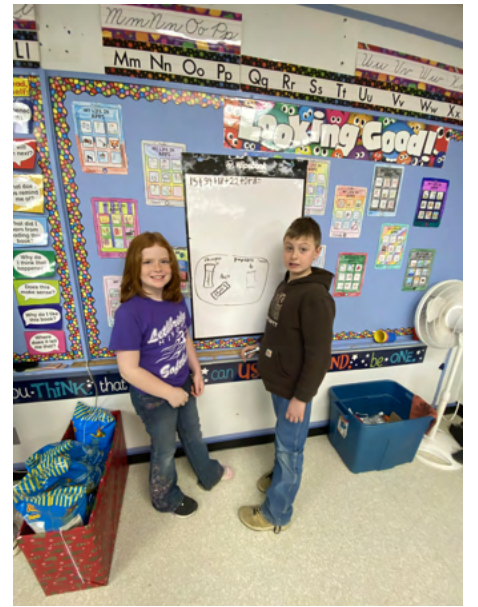
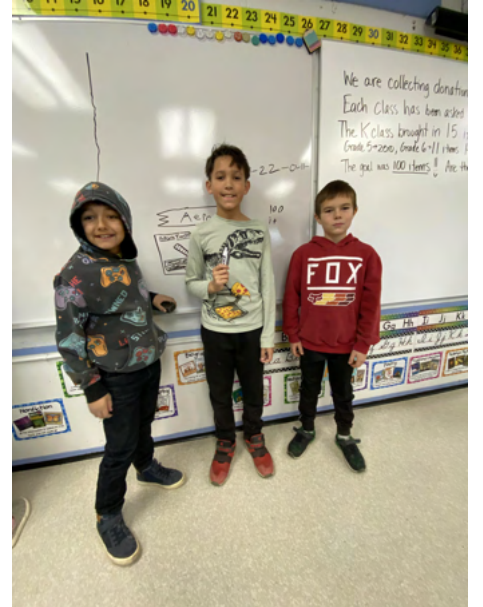
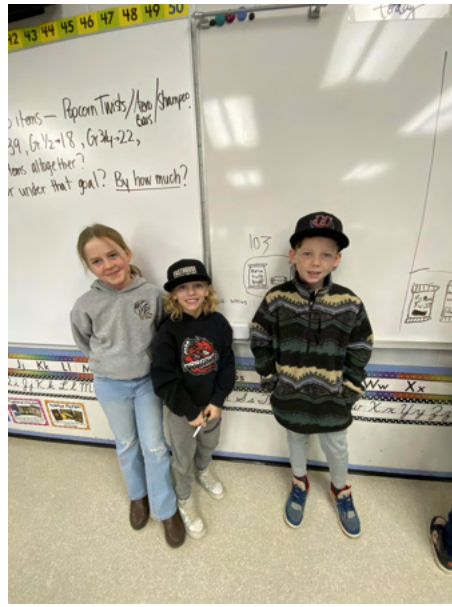

Grade 6 News – Mrs. Jesse

We've made it to my favorite month of the year and I am so excited for all the fun activities we have planned in our classroom and in our school. Please don't hesitate to reach out with questions about all the activities that will be happening, as there will be many!

Math: For the past few weeks, students have been challenged with many tasks using factors and multiples. They used factorization and prime factorization to solve many problems at the whiteboards. They worked with many strategies to discover common multiples and common factors of a variety of numbers. Factor rainbows, value tables, reverse multiplication and specific divisibility rules were all practiced and evaluated. We have moved into order of operations and will start fractions in December!

Science: In science this month, students finished their investigation on wetlands. We jumped into electricity and have been learning about both static and current electricity. Students created safety posters and experimented with short circuits. We will continue our study of circuits in December.

LA: In reading, students have finished their second unit: Interpreting Characters. In December, students will focus on identifying the elements of fiction in a common novel during our Interpretive Book Club unit. In writing, students finished and celebrated their personal narratives. They are working on their second personal essay and will move into some creative writing using Christmas as their theme/topic.

Social: We have finished our third project in our second unit on the regions of Canada. Students have completed an infographic and an I-region I-pad. They then used their infographic to teach a fellow grade five or six student about their region. Together they compared and contrasted the two regions. Students will finish up a postcard project and hopefully a diorama project in December. Students will be asked to bring some materials for their diorama from home.
