Congratulations to the winners of the book fair draw...Winnie Davis and Mrs.Klassen !


Another thank you goes out to everyone that has been donating books, games, puzzles and various craft/building materials to the Learning Commons. Those items are greatly appreciated by all the students.

Music/Fine Arts



What's Happening in 3/4J

What awonderful month to start 2025! It was lovely to see our student's faces come back smiling and eager to get right back to learning! We have some exciting adventures like skating and growing some bean plants!

Math: The Grade 3's turned our attention to addition and subtraction strategies, while our Grade 4's have done the same, but being able to use those same strategies with decimals.

Reading: We are continuing to read "The Wild Robot" and working on our comprehension skills. It has been great reviewing the strategies and students being more confident in their understanding of the book!

Writing: We began our Informative Article unit by choosing atopic we knew quite alot about already. We then researched more about it and are learning how to organize it into paragraphs and article format.

Social Studies: We have moved onto our unit of Cultures and History of Alberta. We are starting to look at the First Nations peoples and how they've interacted with settlers to help create the Alberta we have today. We are having some amazing discussions about the different historical places we have here in Southern Alberta. If you are interested in these discussions, please let me know and we can chat more about it!

Science: We continue to explore how plants function best and some of their different characteristics. It was wonderful to see how connected our students are to nature and their understanding of the topic is very strong! We are also growing bean plants without any soil, but with lots of water and sunlight!

PE: We are learning about the different aspects of basketball, like dribbling, passing, and shooting. We want them to be comfortable with the ball and give them techniques to become more confident in the sport.









February 2025 Grade 3/4 – Mrs. Hudey

We are off to agreat start in 2025! The weather has been amazing and we have enjoyed time outside playing in the snow and skating on the outdoor rink!

Here's afew things that we have been working on in class:

MATH -We are adding and subtracting large numbers, skip counting and starting our multiplication unit. Students have enjoyed avariety of problem solving tasks where they collaborate and solve in small groups.

January Newsletter Grade 6

Phew! I can't believe January is over! What aquick month. I have afeeling February will feel even faster. Here is aquick recap of January and what is to come in February in Grade 6.

Math: Students are just finishing off their number sense units, with representing numbers in various forms: fractions, ratios, decimals and percents. Students will have one last opportunity to demonstrate their understanding of these concepts in aunit test in February. Students also continue to work on all their basic operations and solving skills within each unit. Our next unit will be Algebra.

LA: Students are in the middle of listening to the novel Home of the Brave as aclass. They are also involved in asmall group book club, where they are reading ashared novel with asmall group of peers. They spend time each day reading, discussing and writing about the key literary concepts in their novels. In writing, we are working on our third essay. They are writing aliterary essay based on The Panyee Football club. I am hoping to do one more essay before moving onto non-fiction in March.

Science: We are in the middle of our Energy unit in science. Students have been looking at external and internal forces and their impact on various items. From building catapults to timing cars traveling down ramps, students have been hands-on this term. We also have avisit from Inside Education to help us learn about the Energy sector in Alberta, and we will do some further research following our presentation.

Social: We have just finished our unit on Athens and will now move into looking at another example of democracy -the Iroquois Confederacy. We will spend time learning about their systems of government and the various roles in their society before comparing and contrasting the three systems of government. Students will have opportunities for some more decision-making role plays, and create some Wampum belts as well.
